The CVMA Continues to Raise Concerns Over VMB's Equine Enforcement Cases

Since late 2021, the CVMA has been reviewing and responding to numerous concerns from equine practitioners regarding several enforcement cases brought by the California Veterinary Medical Board (VMB), over which the CVMA also shares concern.

The CVMA and dozens of other equine practitioners and stakeholders gave extensive <u>public commentary</u> on the issue at the <u>January 19 VMB meeting</u>. The VMB requested that the CVMA prepare a presentation for its upcoming April 20 meeting regarding our specific concerns with the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act (VMPA) statutes and regulations as applied to equine practices and any legislative or regulatory proposals that may address those concerns. The CVMA submitted its <u>letter</u> and <u>presentation</u> on the topic; however, last week, the VMB informed the CVMA that the item has been removed from its April 20 meeting agenda.



National Dog Bite Prevention Week is April 10-16, 2022. Each year, over 300,000 bite victims seek medical care in U.S. emergency departments; most of these patients are children, typically between 5 and 9 years old. These injuries often occur because children do not understand how to be safe around dogs. The California Department of Public Health's Don't Let the Dogs Bite: How to be Safe Around Dogs booklets can aid parents in teaching their children how to behave safely around dogs. The booklet includes pictures to color, puzzles to solve, activities to explore, and a Dog Safety Expert certificate.
